These grants support education and youth, health and wellbeing, workforce development, affordable housing, and 'āina and culture on the Garden Isle

LIHUE, KAUA'I, HI – Priscilla Chan and Mark Zuckerberg through the Chan Zuckerberg Kaua'i Community Fund recently awarded a total of \$1 million to benefit 26 nonprofits as part of their ongoing support for organizations across the Garden Isle.

On Kaua'i, Priscilla's and Mark's giving is driven and informed by conversations with local residents, leaders, and service organizations. As such, the fund's priority areas for 2024 are: education and youth, health and wellbeing, workforce development, affordable housing, and 'āina and culture.
